Standing Rules

To the Alliance Member Art Organizations,

Each art organization is asked to promote the young artists in your community and to encourage an interest in fine art by providing them with this opportunity to apply for the annual Alliance Scholarship and to exhibit the winning art in the 18th Annual Best of the Best Fine Art Exhibit. Emphasis is placed on creativity, originality, and the desire to continue their art education.

Two student entries will be chosen to each receive an AFA award of excellence and a cash prize of \$250.

Each art organization may decide its own method of choosing their candidate. These are the Alliance's basic requirements:

One Entry only will be accepted from each member art organization.

Student candidate must be currently attending high school.

Student candidate must have demonstrated some interest in art, their goals and how they intend to continue their art education.

All fine art media will be accepted. One matted, framed, or otherwise appropriately presented piece of art work from each member art organization will be submitted at the designated Alliance of Fine Art board meeting by the delegate or representative from each member art organization. The delegate is the link between the candidate and the Alliance and has the responsibility of providing the candidate's art work to the scholarship competition, keeping the student informed and aware that the awards will be presented during the reception of the Best of the Best Fine Art Exhibit.

Judging will take place at the March 2, 2010 Alliance of Fine Art board meeting. Delegates will review the art work and cast a written ballot. There will be one vote per art organization. The winning entries will be by majority of points vote.

The two winning entries will be on exhibit at the annual Best of the Best Fine Art Exhibit. Awards will be presented at the reception. The student is encouraged to attend this event to receive their award. However, if the student is unable to attend, the AFA will arrange to send the award to the student.

Application forms must be completed and signed by the candidate. The top half goes to the Alliance committee and the bottom half is attached to the art work.

The delegate has the responsibility of notifying the results of the competition to his/her art organization as well as to the student candidate and conveying our appreciation for their participation.

Although significant care is taken with each art entry the Alliance of Fine Art is not responsible for any loss or damage to the art work.
